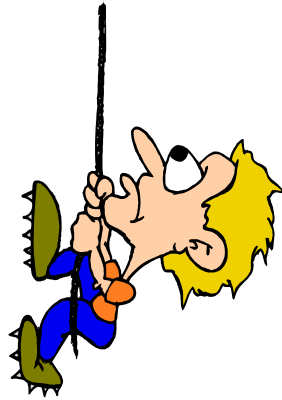

## My Trip To Colombia by Kurt Van Cleef

The wealth of a nation is not measured by its financial fountains but by the cascades of human goodness represented within.
